## The 2016 Gathering & Supper

The 2016 Annual Gathering and Supper was held on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> November 2016. Another successful Gathering was enjoyed by approximately 61 members and guests present to hear a variety of presentations. The President, John Peden, welcomed everyone and after a brief introduction to the Gathering handed over to Chris Gilmore to act as MC for the afternoon keeping all the speakers to their allotted time for the presentations. We started with summaries from those who had received grants from the Club for expeditions, including Donald MacRae who gave a summary of Fortrose Academy's expedition to East Greenland in 2013. This was followed by a presentation containing some spectacular images of Dove Bay, NE Greenland, given by Brigitte and Peter Grosmann. Regrettably, owing to a technical problem, Elspeth Hamilton was unable to present her much-anticipated film taken in Qaanaaq, 2016, though we are grateful nonetheless. After the coffee break, the main talk of the afternoon was by Rev. Bob Shepton to whom we are indebted for sharing his very entertaining and well-received film, 'The Wild Bunch: Belgian climbers'. Chris Gilmore once again provided all the technical equipment for projection of images and amplification of voice as well as running the afternoon's programme.

All speakers kept to time, however the length of the presentation given by the keynote speaker (50 mins) meant that the AGM began at the later time of 5.45 pm, as opposed to the more usual time of 5pm. The minutes of the AGM are included with this newsletter. Those due to stand down at this AGM were John Peden, President, Douglas Anderson, Vice President, Iain Allison, Secretary, Chris Calver, Treasurer, and Jenny Newall. The President thanked them for their service to the club over the past three years. The treasurer may be re-elected and is willing to stand. The President asked for nominations from the floor with no response. Nominations from the committee are: Douglas Anderson as President, Ashley Buchan as Secretary, Stella Spratley as Vice President and Elspeth Hamilton as an ordinary committee member.
